This number represents only the permanent, year round population of the township as determined by the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation. The provincial government does not allow seasonal information to be included in this analysis, even though a large number of crimes relate to seasonal properties. Because of this, and because of the fact that Tay Valley Township has a very large seasonal population, **the above crime rates are extremely misleading.**
